- Original Benson's Committee formed in late 1990s
- Benson's Master Plan completed March 2002
- Historic Structures Report completed 2003
 - Historic structures include:
 - Train Station
 - Benson Office and Kitchen
 - Haselton Barn
 - Historic Structures do not include:
 - Elephant Barn
 - Gorilla House
 - A-Frame
 - The Old Shoe

How we got here

- Transfer property from state to Town of Hudson
 - Completed January, 2009
- Current Benson Park Committee formed early in 2009
- Work in the park started spring 2009
 - To date, over 350 volunteers have contributed time, effort and other donations to the park
 - Hudson Department of Public Works, also a major contributor
 - Many local businesses have contributed materials and labor
- Open House October 2009
- Official Opening May 2010
- Benson Park dedication ceremony September 25, 2010

- Playground
- Cost of equipment taken from Recreation contributions from new home approvals
- Installation supported by volunteers



- Secured the Haselton Barn
 - Security measures taken to protect and preserve the barn



- 9-11 Memorial
 - Funds donated by members of the community
 - Hudson firefighters traveled to NYC to bring back a beam from the World Trade Center
 - Accelerated construction completed in time for dedication on 9/11/2011

- Dog Park
 - Non-profit group formed to design and build dog park
 - Dog park opened September, 2012



- Benches and Picnic Tables
 - Benches were a fundraiser for the Friends of Benson Park



- Bat Houses
 - Built and installed by Litchfield's Campbell High School Biology class in 2010



- Chestnut Tree Project
 - Eight chestnut seeds were planted as part of the American Chestnut Foundation effort to develop a resistant tree









- Restrooms
 - Restrooms are a great improvement to the park in 2019

 - About 30-35 landscape spots have been adopted.
 - Some are single person spots, some are family or group efforts.



- Butterfly Garden
 - Sponsored by GFWC Hudson Women's Club
 - Received 2nd place award for GFWC Community Improvement Project, NH



• The Elephant Barn



- Friends of Benson Park obtained a lease from the Town
 - Approved by voters at 2012 Town Election
- Intent is to turn it into a museum
- Fundraising continues and construction is underway

- Haselton Barn
 - Currently needs preservation work to prevent further deterioration.













- Office Building and Kitchen
 - Restore clay tile roof on the kitchen
 - Replace temporary exterior wall on east side of kitchen
 - Repair and paint siding on the office
 - Reinstall bathroom in the office when sewer and water connections are available
 - Repair/replace interior walls and flooring
 - Repair or replace windows and doors
