4. **Budget Presentations**

Finance Director Kathy Carpentier stated the operating budget is \$25,965,228 which represents a 6.1% increase, with salary @ 5.13% and operations @ 7.1%. There are eight warrant articles at \$397,392. Non-tax revenues are \$14,217,035 which includes \$1,450,000 use of fund balance. There is no increase to Motor Vehicles (\$3.8 million vs \$4.0 actual). As recommended by the Town Assessor, valuation increase is \$30 million (1.2%). The estimated Town tax rate is \$5.10, up 51¢, or 11%. The projected FY06 surplus is \$5,107,162 or 8.5% with an additional use of \$1,450,000. With no other changes, will be \$3,657,162 or 6.1%. Fixed costs are 74.2% (\$19,261,460) and all other costs are 25.8% (\$6,703,768) for a total of 100% (\$25,965,228).

Town Administrator Steve Malizia recommended deferring the default budget, as the health insurance numbers were not in yet. It is anticipated that the figures would be available for the Selectmen's meeting on October 25.
