# **Public Input Related to Non-Agenda Items:**

Mr. Joseph Undercoffler, 137 Musquash Road appeared before the commission to explain the Eagle Scout Project Fund Raising guide lines. Mr. Undercoffler's input was in response to a commission member's concern of how the HCC name was being used in a recent flyer for a carwash fund raiser that was supporting an Eagle Scout project which will be built along the trail system of the Musquash Conserved property.

# A. Forest Evaluation/Conservation Area Visits (Site Walk) Schedule

The Commission members present unanimously agreed to schedule a site walk of Merrill Park and conserved property located next to Robinson Pond to check conditions at both properties. Members will meet at Merrill Park located off Maple Drive July 6, 2017 at 06:30 p.m. If time allows members will drive out to Hazel Wood Drive where a similar inspection of the Robinson Pond Conserved property will be held.

#### III. OTHER BUSINESS

# A: Replacement Trail Signs

NRPC representative Mr. James Battis, 6 Potter Road Hudson presented replacement trail map options along with their associated cost to HCC members. These new trail maps will replace the existing faded maps at the Town Forest and Musquash Pond Conservation Property.

Mr. Battis also provide some details on the Nashua Regional Planning Commission GIS Live Maps. He stated that the NRPC provided a Live Map Tutorial at their quarterly GIS Brown Bag Lunch meeting back in May and that plans where in the works to video tape the tutorial and place it on their new NRPC Youtube Channel. Mr. Battis added that Sara Saskavich from NRPC might be available and willing to attend a HCC meeting and provide an introduction to the ArcGIS Online Simple Viewer for Interactive Trail Maps.

#### II. FINANCIAL STATUS

No outstanding issues noted with the current financial report. A short conversation took place about the Land Use Fees that are collected as part of land development.
