
Nashua Regional Planning Commission (NRPC) is pleased to submit this proposal to provide GIS services to the Hudson Conservation Commission. The Conservation Commission protects the town's natural resources; preserves and maintains important land including town forests and trails; advises the select, planning, and zoning boards on conservation matters; and makes on-site visits and recommendations for wetland, water bodies, and dredge and fill permits. The Commission's present goal for this project is to encourage utilization of the existing trail network on its properties through better mapping. Specifically, the Commission would like to make navigable, mobile trail maps available to its stakeholders along with other complimentary map products for the town's primary open-space properties.

Deliverable 1: Data Collection

This project will leverage and extend the existing NRPC GIS trail inventory in Hudson. Additional trail mapping/GPS will be guided by features depicted on existing trail maps and input from Commission experts. During fieldwork NRPC will also take a limited amount of photography (5-10 locations at each property) as suggested by the Commission to incorporate into the map products. NRPC will create intersection posts from nodes in the GPS data, verify permitted use attributes, and work with the Commission to GPS any missing, important landmarks requiring navigation-level mapping accuracy.

Deliverable 2: Trailhead Kiosk Maps

NPRC will create static pdf maps of the trail systems based upon an appealing and uniform cartographic template. The professionally styled maps will communicate trail system overview, property outlines, suggested loops, permitted uses, information on blazes or other trail markings, images of key locations, and a QR code that brings the user to the property's webpage. These maps will be designed for large-format printing, suitable for posting at the trailhead kiosk, but they may also be printed on letter-sized (8.5"x11") layouts.

Deliverable 3: ESRI StoryMap


NRPC will create an online ESRI Story Map that will market the locations, photos, and key characteristics of properties featured in this project using engaging, interactive, multimedia content.

Deliverable 4: Mobile App

NRPC will create an interactive map on the ESRI ArcGIS online cloud. It will be viewable as its own web page on desktop and mobile browsers and will be available for navigation using ESRI's app for iPhone and Android.

Deliverable 5: Data downloads

To accommodate a variety of technical users NRPC will provide to the Commission generic GPS interchange files (GPX) files of trails and waypoints which can be hosted on the Commission's website for public download or provided to various town departments.

Pricing

Each type of electronic deliverable is estimated individually according to two scenarios: The Commission may choose to undertake Option 1, Pilot project only, which including a kiosk/brochure map, a mobile application, and associated GPX data only. Option 2 would include the pilot as Phase 1, and then Phase 2 would cover four additional properties of the Commission's choosing and an ESRI StoryMap. Additional properties beyond 5 could be added at a cost of \$1060/each. No charges will be assessed for trail data collection under any scenario.

Assumptions

Hudson Conservation Commission will provide written or in-person guidance for GPS field data capture. If requested, NRPC will provide a copy of all project deliverables to Hudson including all ESRI data files. NRPC will also retain a copy of the project outputs, but subsequent edits and updates are not assumed in this scope. This quote does not include custom programming or any large-volume hard-copy printing. NRPC assumes responsibility of hosting online project outputs created during the project.

Total timeline for Option 2 would be approximately 1 year from notice to proceed.


