
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Dear Mr. Matsubara,

My name is Bill Collins and I am the Chairman of the Hudson Conservation Commission. I'm writing to you regarding ATV usage on the town's Musquash Conservation property that abuts your land. We on the commission have been receiving an increased number of complaints from residents regarding ATV's and other types of off-road vehicles within the Musquash Conservation Area and are concerned for the safety of all those using the property for enjoyable hike. We realize that this is not a new problem and, at times, have seen ATV usage taper off but this does not seem to be happening currently. After a bit of observations we have found a majority of these vehicles are entering the conservation property from an accessible point located adjacent to Deer Run and Dumont Road. Seeing as this point runs across a portion of your yard, and with your permission we'd like to utilize that same access point so that the Highway Department can place a few large rocks at the point shown below to possibly reduce these incursion and keep everyone safe.

SITE WALK (MEETING MINUTES): Below is a listing of minutes for the Hudson Conservation Commission. Minutes are not a verbatim record of each meeting, but rather represent a summary of the discussion and actions taken at the meeting. Summary:

The purpose of the site walk was to view the property and evaluate its overall esthetic qualities, topography, wetland features and other unique attributes of this land for the potential of permanent conservation protections. Some observations of note, a healthy stand of hardwood trees cover a majority of the property. Small interconnected wetland features appear to crisscross the areas we walked in. Signs of wildlife noted (deer rub, tracks and trails observed). The eastern side of the property is primarily made up of ponds and large wetland complexes which sustain migratory birds and other aquatic species. Nesting Blue Herons and Mallard ducks with their offspring were observed. Although there were a few old items observed (Bed spring, engine component, fridge component) no other signs of dumping on the property were observed.

No decision or motions were made during this property evaluation.
