Over the past year, the Conservation Commission has conducted numerous trail maintenance work days at the Musquash Conservation Lands resulting in several significant activities:

- 1. Typical GPS Track of the property 2020 boundaries (Photo 1)
- 2. Sketch of actual boundary areas visually inspected for 2021 (Photo 2)
- 3. New bridges Near Woodland Drive (Photo 3)
- 4. Town GIS image showing new bridge location (Photo 4)
- 5. Property corner marking (Photo 5)
- 6. New parking Area (Photo 6)

Monitoring surveys of the Musquash Conservation Land, encompassing both the Hamblett and Nash Properties, were performed on 12 December 2021 by Hudson Conservation Commission member Bill Collins. This year a more concentrated effort was made along the boundaries where residents a-but the property rather than a full boundary survey (Photo 2). No encroachments were noted at this time. Additionally various members of the Conservation Commission walk the property on a regular basis and perform routine maintenance along the trail system.

The ongoing pandemic has kept the Musquash Conservation Area in the spot light. It's not uncommon to see folks enjoying the local trail systems on a regular basis and I see no end to this interest anytime soon. Improvements mentioned in the 2020 monitoring report were implemented which resulted in a more pleasurable experience for visitors to the area. With the dedicated work of commission members, support of our local town officials and local volunteers the trails are well maintained, easily passable and clearly marked. Continued emphasis will be placed on trail maintenance to support a safe environment for all who visit and utilize the property for recreational purposes.

The Boy Scouts completed two new stream crossing this year near the Woodland Drive entry point making for safer passage along the Hamblett/Nash Trail (Photo 3) (Photo 4).

Noted in last year's report was a plan to improve parking for added visitor safety and convenience (Photo 6) is a shot of the newly completed parking area. A big thanks goes to our Town Engineering Staff and Department of Public Works for getting this done.

Planned projects for 2022 will include trail expansion into Pelham and improved tail marking along established routes.
