Protect your family and community by eliminating mosquito breeding grounds around your home.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

1. Dump Standing Water Weekly

- Empty water from buckets, flowerpots. pet bowls, birdbaths, and tarps.
- Store containers upside down whennot use.

2. Clean Gutters & Downspouts

 Clear leaves and debris to prevent water from pooling.

3. Maintain Pools & Hot Tubs

- Keep water treated and circulating.
- Cover when not in use.

4. Remove Yard Clutter

 Tires, toys, tools, and other items can collect rainwater.

5. Cover or Treat Rain Barrels

 Use mosquito-proof screens or larvicides approved for potable water

6. Repair Screens & Seal Cracks

Keep mosquitoes from entering your home.

7. Trim Vegetation & Seal Cracks

 Mosquitoes rest in cool, shady areas. Keep grass and shrubs trimmed.

LET'S WORK TOGETHER

Help reduce mosquito populations and prevent the spread of diseases like:

- West Nile Virus
- Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE)
- Jamestown Canyon Virus

COMMON HIDDEN BREEDING SITES:

- Wheelbarrows
- Trash can lids
- Plant saucers
- Boat covers
- Folds in tarps
- Unused fountains

PREVENTION IS KEY!

Even a bottle cap can hold enough water for hundreds of mosquito larvae.

Stay proactive - check your yard every 7 days.

Regular yard checks = Fewer bites + Healthier community!
