To Board Members and Planners,

For almost 50 years we have lived on Stoney Lane, a residential street in the northeast corner of Hudson. At one time it was an area where you could hear birds sing in the morning and dogs bark in the evening. Probably you live on a street like ours too. It's not unusual to see folks strolling on this wide street in the evening. You'll also see joggers, walkers, kids riding their bicycles and families pushing baby carriages or walking their dogs. It's a wide rural street without sidewalks. When the GPS came into use, drivers were directed to use our street as a convenient bypass for Rt 102 and Rt 111. Since then, gravel trucks, delivery vans, and even 18-wheelers fly down our street. None of these vehicles adhere to the speed limit sign of 25 mph - *none*.

If the Logistics Center plan passes, it will increase commercial traffic through our local streets. Trucks from this Center heading for Londonderry and Salem, points south be taking local roads and add wear and tear on their streets too. A BAN on all non residential local thru traffic for the health and safety of Hudson citizens and the wear/tear on our local roads will be necessary. We are strongly advising that you **veto** the proposed Logistics Center plan. The increase of traffic, additional wear/tear on our roads, noise and the loss of our rural character cannot balance what ever Hudson and surrounding areas will gain, if anything, from this project.

Dear Planning Board,

Thank you board for the opportunity to make public comments on the HLC project and the fiscal impact study presented by Hillwood at the August 12 planning board meeting. While I may have fallen off a turnip truck as some point, I don't believe it was recent.

Question regarding Real Estate Evaluation – My comments are reflective of the presentation of the developer. It does not seem that the developer has spent an appropriate effort in providing a meaningful evaluation of real estate valuations.

The gap in real-estate transactions in the Rena neighborhood that the developer referenced in their presentation should certainly stand out as an error in their thoroughness. As one of the board member noted, there have been transactions in the neighborhood and Southern NH is certainly hot market in property transactions.

At a minimum, information is easily available Town website under the GIS map on property transactions. At the top level you can see the year and price the seller paid to buy the property as well as the year and price for the current owner.

You can drill down to see more transaction history. Certainly back to the 1990's.

As for private transactions, the developer states that this information isn't easily found. The GIS map seems to show all the transactions, including what would appear to be private transactions. By way of example, one of the properties (in Fairway neighborhood) relatively recently transacted at \$100k. Easily recognized as an outlier, this was likely a private sale. If I can find the information, I would assume that an expert in the field would have been able to find it.

The developer, in my mind didn't make a reasonable effort on the real estate impact worthy of the respect of the residents of the town of Hudson.

Subject: Financial Impact Study - HLC Project - Comments for public record

Dear Planning Board,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide public comment regarding the financial impact study provided by Hillwood. It opens a number of questions for consideration.

Question #1 - The employee counts for the financial impact don't correspond with the employment counts for the traffic study. For the traffic study we have been given a figure of 1029, for the financial study 1400. While the traffic study does make some assumptions based on the size of the building, what number is it? Certainly it plays nicely to downplay the traffic figures while up-selling the employment estimates.

Is this being transparent? I don't think so.

Question #2 Regarding estimated costs of community services (fire, police etc).

The developer, in Table #1 of their analysis, estimates that the town currently spends ~\$3M per year in expenditures for non-residential property. The developer, also in Table #1 calculates that the project will represent 58% of total non-residential property values once completed, more than doubling the current base. There is a Refinement Coefficient of 13.86% applied to calculate a cost of ~240K per year to the town.

While there may be some consolidation of costs due to the consolidation of square footage into a comparatively small area (if you think 3M sq-ft of space is small), where did this "co-efficient" come from? It is an easy way to fudge the figures.

Is this being transparent? I don't think so.

If, for example, a new ladder truck is necessary due to the building height, might this "co-efficient" be higher? Might it even be parity? I don't know specific costs of a ladder truck, but I am sure close to \$750K-\$1M and you might need a crew to operate it.

Question #3 Regarding income to local residents.

The developer predicts ~\$81.5M in wages from this development. If we look at the MEDIAN annual salary including overtime and bonuses to Amazon employees, in 2019 that figure was \$36,640 USD (available from the Amazon investor reports). That median figure would include not only warehouse workers, but also higher paid top level executives, lawyers, marketing personal etc.

The proposed number of Amazon employees is just slightly over 1000 – this calculates to ~\$37M USD in wages and bonuses based on a median Amazon employee.

This is a FAR cry from the \$81.5M in wages offered in the report.

Let us not overlook that the developer's presentation indicates only 5% of employees would be at higher level pay scales. The calculation on median wages of ~\$37M, is being very generous to a developer that continually misleads the residents of Hudson.

Good morning,

After watching the Planning Board meeting of September 9, 2020, I have a question about the salary (wages) Hillwood's consultant presented to the town.

From the initial report Ms. Barrett submitted:

Total wages= \$81,536,000 for direct wages
Total direct employees=1,400

From previous meetings, Hillwood has said and put on slides the following:

Wages would be \$15-\$17/hour
5% of the jobs would be managerial or high-tech type jobs.

Using what we have been publicly told, I'm having a hard time getting to the \$81 million number.

$1400 * 5\% = 70$ managerial/high-tech jobs
 $1330 \text{ employees} * \$17 \text{ per hour} * 40 \text{ (hours/week)} * 52 \text{ (weeks)} = \$47,028,800/\text{year}$ in direct wages

That leaves \$34,507,200 to be split up between the remaining 70 employees in the managerial/high-tech positions. On average, that would be \$492,960/person. Now that would be truly remarkable as that is CEO level salary that most small business CEO's don't make.

My question is, how does Hillwood get to the \$81 million figure when what they have said publicly doesn't get you there and it's highly unlikely that Amazon will be paying nearly \$500k for those 70 jobs?

The math doesn't seem to work. Please let me know where I've gone wrong in my example above.

This letter is in response to the Friel's attorney, Thomas Leonard, on 9/9/20 and his reference to our opposition to the Hillwood project, as a "small group of activists". First, our group is not small. We have hundreds of active participants plus 4000+ signatures have been collected to stop this project. Second, the word "activist" has negative connotations which we do not deserve. We have taken the "high road" in this battle. We will continue despite Hillwood's vagueness, inaccurate information, and poor comparisons. As "activists" we have pooled our experience, knowledge, and intellectual resources to inform the public about logistic centers and the negative impacts they create. Many of us are 30 to 40 year residents, some in Green Meadow, others across town. We are proponents of maintaining our way of life, both in our neighborhood and in our community. No amount of mitigation will alleviate the negative impacts of thousands of additional tractor trailers, vans, and vehicles on our already "F" rated, inadequate roads. All forms of pollution associated with these trucks and facilities will be our towns problems FOREVER!

Ironically, this proposal comes at a time when our nice little town has earned national attention as the 7th most desirable town to live in this year by Realtor.com. Hudson was identified because of its attractive qualities and proximity to Boston. "...demand is surging and homes are flying off the market – sometimes within hours of being listed." As a long-time resident of Hudson, I am writing for the third time to express my strong opposition to the proposed Hudson Logistics Center at Green Meadow Golf Course. The first time I wrote, in June of this year, I was writing my observations as a resident of Lowell Road.

In August, I wrote because I found a document titled NH DOT Statewide Freight Plan, Final Report 2019. I read it thoroughly and shared my observations with all of you. I also attended the NRPC virtual meeting on Wednesday, September 9 (a mere five days ago!). Brian Groth was on the call to represent Hudson. The NRPC acknowledged that there are areas in Hudson which are already on the list of what is considered 'High Priority' for the entire State of New Hampshire. The Nashua Regional Planning Commission did not have their traffic study complete and they stated it would probably be three weeks before their results were conclusive. An estimated date was given as the first week in October.

So it was with extreme surprise and frustration the next day that I read Governor Sununu's letter dated September 10 to the town. He incorrectly stated that the Hillwood project had already secured the necessary approvals to go forward. There is no evidence at all "the State has demonstrated that the Hudson Logistics Center proponent can mitigate for their impacts in the vicinity of the project." The Governor, I believe must have just read the massive Langan traffic impact report; and concluded that it was both factual and that it met the NHDOT's requirements.

The Langan report on pages 3 and 4 incorrectly states that Walmart Boulevard (East and West) is a "two-lane private driveway" with no posted speed limit. The very next point is that "Rena Avenue is a two lane east west local road under local jurisdiction." When these statements are shown grouped together, it is very misleading. Walmart Boulevard is at least 5 lanes wide (three lanes exit Sam's and Walmart, and two lanes enter each property). Knowing that this is a misleading statement, I suspect that there is a lot more other misleading information!

The Governor doesn't know this town and he is way out of line to try to bully the Hudson Selectmen into approval this monstrous Hillwood proposal. The Selectmen thus far have done a fantastic job with studying all aspects and trying to remain impartial. I urge you to continue to weigh the facts, at least until the NHDOT concludes its traffic findings. A Governor who is

seeking re-election in a year when he knows his political party is flailing is trying to bribe Hudson with only the promise "of the preliminary design and engineering phase" of Hudson Boulevard. He uses the language that "the timeline to in which project funding is available is limited" because of economic conditions. It is not true. The State DOT has millions of excess funds which I learned from attending the NRPC meeting. If time is short, it is only because the Gubernatorial Election is in 7 weeks. Creating low-paying jobs with little advancement opportunity, is not worth destroying the whole southern NH region, and most importantly, Hudson. Our infrastructure cannot handle the impact! Every day does not have to become a traffic nightmare as residents go to work and go about their normal activities.

As a Hudson resident, taxpayer, and voter I again state that my family is against the Hillwood HLC proposal. I continue to write because I passionately care about my town, my neighbors and my quality of life. Please VOTE NO.

Re: Reprehensible Conduct by the Friel's Family Lawyer towards Hudson Planning Board and Citizens

At the September 9, 2020 Planning Board Meeting, Green Meadow Golf Club Owner's Family Lawyer Thomas J. Leonard, literally demanded the Planning Board alternate members, William Cole and George Hall recuse themselves from Hudson's Planning Board review of the Hillwood proposal for Green Meadow. Why? Simply because they live in "proximity" to Hillwood's proposed development.

Mr. Leonard's demand was nothing more than a crude attempt to 1) **intimidate Planning Board members** who should be asking probing questions and 2) **instill fear in Hudson residents** who courageously voice serious concerns about Hillwood's aspirations to develop the Green Meadow property. Mr. Leonard should redirect his frustrations away from town officials and residents, and towards the applicant's team who has **brought increased Planning Board scrutiny** upon themselves, because they have been ill prepared and vague in answering questions. Furthermore, our town needs to voice in no uncertain terms that any attempt to curtail our citizen's rights to speak freely will not be tolerated.

Intimidating Planning Board Members-

Mr. Leonard's argued that Mr. Cole and Mr. Hall are already conflicted because their homes are in "proximity" to the proposed development and/or citizens who have voiced project concerns; therefore, by implication they have an interest in the "outcome which differs from the interests of other [town] citizens". There are several problems with Mr. Leonard's reasoning:

- **Proximity-** If project proximity is the litmus test for eligibility to the Planning Board, then no Hudson resident could fill these roles because this project if approved will affect every town resident.
- **Experience-** There are few people in town with as much experience and character as Mr. Cole who was a previous Chairman of the Board of the Selectmen as well as a Planning Board Member and Mr. Hall who previously served as the Chairman of the Planning Board.
- **Suspicious Timing-** Because Mr. Leonard did not request this action at the start of the process, and there has not been a reason to make this demand now, one has to presume his goal is now to intimidate Mr. Cole, Mr. Hall and other Planning Board Members.
- **Probing is Promoting Objectivity-** Asking probing questions and applying critical reasoning is part of being objective and represents the standard of care inherent in the Planning Board Member's role.
 - With a project of this magnitude, the applicant should expect challenging questions, especially when they present incomplete analyses or draws spurious conclusions (*as occurred most recently with the hasty Property Value Analysis where data was missing or incorrectly referenced, and challenging methodologies were applied*).
 - The applicant understands these types of facilities have been receiving tremendous scrutiny as towns across the US question whether the benefits have been worth the consequences (*e.g. Grand Island NY, Braintree MA, and Milford MA who is desperately trying to normalize the chaotic environment Amazon created with a much smaller facility*).

- **Obvious Self-Interest-** Ironically, the greatest source of self-interest the town faces in this process is an overzealous land-owner, and applicant with millions at stake, both with a motive to fast-track the proposal, presumably leaving the project's consequences to be "mitigated" or remediated by the town.

Instilling Fear in Hudson Residents-

Mr. Leonard and Hillwood are trying to intimidate honest law-abiding citizens exercising their constitutional rights e.g.:

- **Dismissing Legitimate Concerns-** Referring to anyone questioning the applicant's proposal as part of the "activist opposition" and going as far as to hand out a map that pin-points the homes of Green Meadow subdivision residents who have voiced "opposition" in any fashion. He went on to discredit residents' concerns regarding "noise, air-quality, storm water runoff, and over all visual impact" (*ironically, I believe he left out traffic and diminution of property values, perhaps recognizing them as being more obvious and more challenging to dismiss*). These fear-tactics feel a bit personal as I have written to the Planning Board opposing aspects of this project, so presumably I appear on Mr. Leonard's off-putting "black-list map". I am a private person and resent this.
- **Hillwood's Enablement-** Similar unprofessional behavior is exhibited by the Hillwood's Justin Dunn, who without basis tries to diminish citizen's concerns as being only related to a small group of abutters. Hillwood's marketing and messaging should not get ahead of reality, especially since nearly 4,000 individuals (*and growing*) have signed an e-petition expressing opposition to this project.
- **Silencing Opposing Views-** Mr. Leonard also criticized the grassroots effort SaveHudsonNH.org which was formed to professionally disseminate information and perspectives related to the project during a pandemic and time when local newspapers are limited.

This proposal is far too large and complex, and the consequences far too enduring, to be left to simply hope for a good outcome. Neither opponents nor supporters, should be silenced or intimidated with these tactics!

Lack of Preparedness Leads to Increased Scrutiny-

I am a direct abutter to the golf course, which contrary to Mr. Leonard's view does not affect my objectivity; it simply means, I took an early interest in understanding the project scope. My observations thus far have been, Hillwood's plans have appeared hasty and persistently vague, and Hillwood lacks timely follow-through. It also might surprise Mr. Leonard, that I was not opposed to the 2006 Lifestyle Center proposal; however, I did candidly voice specific concerns to the developer. That developer, to their credit worked tirelessly and professionally to address these concerns, even coming to my Boston office to review plans and ask for feedback. In contrast, Hillwood, has failed the simplest tasks (*just one small example- for an abutter's line-of-sight analysis Hillwood representatives dictated 2 dates of availability, with 2 days advanced notice. To accommodate, I canceled important work meetings, and several months later still haven't seen an analysis*). Consequently, the lack of preparedness on Hillwood's part should draw more uncomfortable questioning i.e.:

- **Hasty Analysis-** Hillwood has yet to demonstrate constructive staff-work, planning expertise, or ability to sufficiently describe the working of one of the largest projects in NH. They are worryingly far less prepared, yet far more anxious, than the previous [Lifestyle Center] applicant who wanted to develop this property.
- **Complex Project-** Hillwood's challenges seemingly result from working on a project that is one of the largest in their portfolio and complicated by its placement in the midst of a residential town.
- **Unreasonable Timeline-** Hillwood did themselves a disservice by setting an absurdly unrealistic goal of breaking ground by September- this created the conditions for hasty work and a desire to simply "check the box and move-on". Recently you can hear the urgency in the applicant's narrative, dictating to the Planning Board what their minimum duties are. Consequently, the Planning Board has become the town's de facto protection from owning all sorts of massive unintended consequences.

- **Misplaced Frustration-** If Mr. Leonard is upset by the resulting scrutiny, then he should not blame or question Planning Board Members' objectivity or Hudson's concerned citizenry. He should steer his frustration towards Hillwood's lack of preparedness or hasty methods, rather than waste the town's time and resources on listening to baseless complaints.

Mr. Leonard's tactics, presumably endorsed by Hillwood, are detracting from the application process and if left unchecked will besmirch the reputation of our Planning Board members who are all selflessly volunteering to serve our town. Our town's elected officials need to make it clear in no uncertain terms to Mr. Leonard and Hillwood that tactics to intimidate the Planning Board or limit our residents' freedom of speech will not be tolerated. A strong position on the part of the Town is required to avoid this applicant from pushing the established process out of control.



Dear Chairman Malley and Planning Board members,

The Hudson Logistics Center land use decision before you, brings back memories of an historic land use decision made by Hudson residents roughly 40 years ago that has resulted in regrettable long-term consequences. It was the decision to not purchase the 120-acre former Friary property on Lowell Road. Unfortunately, that proposal lost by a very slim margin. The regrettable consequence is that Hudson town services: town hall, library, police, public works senior center and community center are now scattered from one end of town to the other rather than consolidated at one location. When driving by the former Friary site today we cannot help but wonder what an attractive, functional, and less costly town center Hudson would have if it had acquired that property. Additional town benefits that would have been gained include space for recreation fields and one-half mile of Merrimack River shore line, a remarkable natural resource that Hudson simply ignores.

We bring this to your attention in hopes that Hudson does not make another regrettable land use decision because it did not take into account long-term impacts. Lots of jobs: that's what Amazon says it will bring to Hudson. They say they will have 1,000-2,500 employees at their Hudson location. But, let's dig deeper. How many are part-time or seasonal jobs? How many are drivers; in recent months 1,200 Amazon drivers across the U.S. were laid off when Amazon cut ties with delivery service firms (CNBC 8/13/2020). Will the higher-paying managerial and technical jobs be local hires or are they already Amazon employees? Amazon's hourly wage may be higher than the State's minimum wage, but is it a living wage in this area given the high cost of housing? An MIT study showed that in New Hampshire, a living wage for an adult with one child was \$26.72 and for a two adult/one adult working family was \$24.30 (livingwage.mit.edu/states/33). How many jobs will eventually be automated or outsourced to robots?

Will there be a net increase in new jobs? A 2018 study by the Economic Policy Institute looked at Amazon fulfillment centers across the country. It found that over a two-year period the host county gained more warehousing and storage jobs but there was NO OVERALL INCREASE in private-sector jobs county-wide, possibly due to loss of other jobs.

Amazon's treatment of its employees does not always get favorable reviews. Employees have complained about long hours, grueling working conditions, continual timed monitoring of each task as well as injuries (businessinsider.com 2/19/2019). A Fall River, MA Amazon facility had 125 employee injuries in 2018 alone (Herald News 12/11/2019). Employees in Minnesota went on strike on Amazon Prime Day to protest the efficiency metric called "the rate" which times employees' productivity (theverge.com 7/16/2019) . In San Bernardino County, CA, 150 former Amazon warehouse employees, residents and labor organizers protested at the Hillwood offices (same developer as here) to challenge Amazon working conditions, lack of a living wage and air pollution (vice.com 1/23/2020). Three employees at the Nashua Amazon facility were sickened when chemicals were mixed (WMUR 1/9/2020).

If Amazon is such a great place to work and its jobs so needed, why does it continually need to air such rosy commercials showing its happy employees? Amazon uses jobs as one of its selling points. But, before we fall under Amazon's spell, consider if the possibility of no net increase in jobs is worth all the other negative aspects of this project such as traffic, noise, pollution and an increased burden on town services? This is more traffic on a road that already has a grade of "F" from the State.

The residential neighborhoods and businesses off Lowell Road in South Hudson enter and exit ONLY onto Lowell Road. I know since I live in one of those neighborhoods. Trying to get out of our neighborhoods will be brutal. Expect longer commuting times. This increased traffic will impact people driving from Tyngsborough and Dracut as well. People will use the heavily-traveled back roads to avoid Lowell Road making them even more congested. Truck drivers using GPS are sure to find them as well. Remember these back roads are often narrow, winding, bordered by houses with kids and have no sidewalks. Many residents and truck drivers will head south to the Tyngsborough Bridge. Residents in North Hudson may opt to cross over the northern Hudson-Nashua bridges to avoid heading south. All of these bridges are also congested.

These diesel trucks are likely to pollute the air; diesel fumes and particulates are known carcinogens. Trucks heading to the Sagamore Bridge could sit idling at the 3 traffic lights between the site and the bridge. Image this extra traffic at the Wal-Mart and Sam's Club intersection, especially on weekends and holidays. Both of those businesses allow trucks and RVs to stay overnight in their parking lots. Are they (and shoppers) up to potentially having lots of trucks parking overnight? I don't know about you, but Hudson doesn't need all this additional traffic.

We are writing to express our extreme disappointment that Gov. Chris Sununu has chosen to get involved at this time in the Town of Hudson's on-going process of examining the proposed Hudson Logistics Center. The process is far from over and this is a decision for the Town of Hudson to make. The Governor implies that Hillwood has met the requirements for approval – far from it! They have not completed submission of their reports; they have changed the plans; and have requested a number of meeting deferrals from both the Planning Board and the Conservation Commission. Hillwood has not received any State or local permits. Members of the public and members of the various Boards have many unanswered questions. Hillwood keeps saying that they will answer our questions, but when?

Moreover, we resent the pressure being applied by the Governor that IF the Town approves the Hudson Logistics Center, the State will work to assist the Town with the proposed Hudson Boulevard. Sounds like a quid pro quo.

The Hudson Logistics Center is a Town issue not a political election issue. The Governor must realize that construction of the Hudson Boulevard will negatively impact those Hudson residents whose homes are in the path of or alongside the proposed highway. And what about the wetlands issue, which in large part is why the former Circumferential Highway wasn't approved in the first place.

The Town of Hudson, its employees, and the Boards/Commissions charged with reviewing this proposal should be left to complete their review without interference and undue outside pressure. The Planning Board is already being pressured about the removal/recusal of alternate members. The Town doesn't need any more pressure.

TO THE EDITOR:

Amazon wants to come to Hudson. What would it bring? Along with traffic, noise, pollution and a burden on town resources is the very real possibility of a damaging fire. Google the Amazon Redlands fire. Just this past June 5th, the 3-year old LA-area Amazon facility (the size of just 1 of the 3 buildings proposed here) burned to the ground despite the efforts of 6 fire departments and presumably the latest in fire suppression equipment; nearby trucks also burned. Adjacent Highway 10 was shut down.

Does Hudson have the capability, equipment and personnel to handle such a massive fire? Here, there would be three massive buildings up to 50 feet high. Amazon is the proposed tenant of 2 of the buildings. What is the flammability of the contents of the buildings? Adjacent to the buildings there will be diesel-fueled trucks and box trucks. The proposed buildings would have 363 loading docks, 840 additional truck parking spots and about 1800 car parking spots. Diesel and gasoline are highly flammable. I Googled this: 1 gallon of gasoline is equivalent to 14 sticks of dynamite! Also check out the semi-truck fire and chemical leak at an Amazon facility in Phoenix in July. People had to shelter in place. Will Hudson need additional hazmat or other equipment to put out such facility or diesel fires?

Has Hudson developed a detailed emergency plan for such an emergency? How quickly could other area fire departments respond to assist? Would all the needed fire equipment be able to access and get close to the building if there are already other trucks parked there? If the highway and local roads had to close, is there an evacuation plan for the employees, neighbors in the nearby residential areas and the rest of Hudson? Could they handle fires spreading to nearby residential areas? Consider how far the smoke, fumes, and particulates will spread through the air and even into the Merrimack River. Are Hudson, Nashua and Tyngsborough ready for this?

The Hudson Planning Board will need to ensure that the Hudson and other regional fire departments have detailed emergency plans, equipment and personnel to handle such an emergency. The Hudson Fire Department, the Town of Hudson and Hudson taxpayers must be prepared to purchase additional equipment and hire additional personnel if needed.

A project like this belongs in a wide-open or industrial area not in an area surrounded by residential neighborhoods. So, here's the big question: "Is this *really* what Hudson wants or needs? Visit savehudsonnh.org for more information.

Dear **Gary Frederick SVP, Michael Alderman SVP, and Justin Dunn VP,**

I have just received your company's "Dear Neighbor" letter in the mail, and I must point out some major concerns for us residents actually living in Hudson, NH.

1.) **Environmental**

- Hillwood has celebrated preserving green space in their proposal. Are not these parcels simply the protected wetlands and the river's flood zone (thus undevelopable)?
- What will happen to the hundreds of wildlife species displaced by this proposed development?
- What are the findings of the wetland and water flow studies, specifically with regards to the following affects of:
 - natural precipitation run-off to the water table, existing wetlands, river and abutters, absent the absorption of 200+ acres of grass?
 - construction to the water table?
 - the disruption of the water table to Limit Brook – both upstream and downstream?
 - water quality impact of the Merrimack River due to absent the absorption of 200+ acres of grass as the river is used for drinking water for downstream communities?
 - diesel leaks and run-off from the vehicles?
- What is the plan to prevent and, if needed, mitigate diesel leaks and run-off?
- Will an on-site re-fueling permit ever be sought?
- What are the results of noise and air pollution studies of a 24/7 facility that abuts the Merrimack river, wetlands and a residential neighborhood; specifically with regards to diesel pollutants, artificial light, and operational noises.

2.) Traffic

Per Hillwood's Hudson Logistics Center Website (June 6, 2020): "Approximately 150 to 200 tractor trailers and 35 to 50 box truckswill travel to and from the Logistics Center each day. The vast majority of the trucks entering and exiting the Hudson Logistic Center will come directly from the Everett Turnpike on Sagamore Bridge Road – two simple turns in both."

- When was the last traffic study completed? Did it incorporate Hillwood's estimate of 200 tractor trucks, 50 box trucks and 2,000 employee cars? Did it incorporate the additional cars from the 80 apartments being constructed at the old Friar property?
- Does the Sagamore Bridge or the Everett Turnpike have the excess capacity for this additional traffic? What is the overflow affect to the feeder roads, Lowel Rd, River Rd, Dracut Rd, Wason Rd, Routes 101 and 111, and Route 3 North and South?
- Hudson River Place (2006) published plans that had a direct access road from the Sagamore Bridge to the development, why is that not included in Hillwood's proposed plan? Hillwood's plans intend to use Lowell Rd to Mercury Systems Driveway (Walmart Blvd) and utilize the access easement to extend the road over the wetlands.
- Has there been an independent validation to the developer's claims? The number of trucks in and out does not seem realistic (approximately 0.9% of capacity) and does not include the third building. What are the projections in 15 years (end of lease)? What is the maximum utilization of these buildings with several hundred loading docks?

With all of these issues in mind, generating "new tax revenue" and "creating jobs" do not appear to be more significant impacts to the town, but rather much more detrimental to Hudson residents. Your logistics center will negatively impact our livelihood of being able to live and maintain lower living costs and preserving the little wildlife and greenery that is left. Change your plans. Allow the residents of Hudson to place their votes of what they want, since they are the ones who have to live with your company's disturbances on a daily basis.

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Planning Board Members,

First, I want to emphasize the importance of getting the extent of the operations that will occur at the Hudson Logistics Center. Given the size of the facility and the number of loading docks and parking spots for both trucks and passenger vehicles, I'm skeptical of the low number of daily trips that Hillwood and Amazon are projecting. However, even if they are correct on a typical day when the facility opens, we need to take into account seasonality, growth, and the possibility that another tenant may take over and operate at a much higher level. While the traffic impact study states the NHDOT has "approved" the trip generation used, it also states that "tenant specific data were used". The safest analysis would be to consider the maximum level at which the facility can operate.

This affects not just traffic, but other concerns such as noise and pollution. If there is more activity than assumed, these other studies will not sufficiently predict the impacts to the community. Also, whatever numbers are correct should be used consistently across the different impact studies. The sound study by OAA assumed 8 trucks operating within the same hour. However, pages 116-117 of the traffic impact study predict that between 5-6AM there will be 10 tractor trailer trucks, 40 box trucks, and more than 200 cars operating from lots A and B alone.

Second, I'm concerned that a number of the proposed traffic mitigation strategies involve changes that may prevent safe bicycle traffic along Lowell road. I see nothing in the traffic study that addressed bicycles.

For example, if we consider the southbound stretch of Lowell Rd between Walmart and Mercury Systems, there is presently a wide shoulder that provides ample space for comfortable bicycle travel. The traffic study proposes adding a dedicated right-turn lane here, which would presumably shrink or eliminate the shoulder. In either case, the correct riding position for a cyclist continuing south would be in the right-most straight lane. That is, in the lane to the left of right-only turn into the proposed entrance to the Hudson Logistics center, with its notable truck traffic, in a busy 35mph zone, uphill. I expect many cyclists, especially those who are younger, have less skill, or have less experience, will not feel comfortable making this maneuver and will instead use the right-only lane to go straight, creating conflict and possible collisions with traffic going into the Hudson Logistics Center. This is an issue that needs a professional eye.
