PURPOSE OF PLAN: Lot Line Relocation – Warrant Article 7 (2022). Transfer of property to the Hudson Lions Club.

COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS:

BACKGROUND

There is a baseball field, pond, and gravel parking area on Map 182 Lot 142, which is owned by the Lions Club. The baseball field and gravel parking area currently cross the lot line so they are partially located on Map 182 Lot 109, which is owned by SAU81. Bleachers for the baseball field are also located on Map 182 Lot 109. The proposed lot line relocation would transfer 0.511 acres from Map 182 Lot 109 to Map 182 Lot 142 so the baseball field, parking area, and bleachers would all be on the same lot.

Warrant Article 7 on the March 8, 2022 Hudson School District Ballot proposed transferring property from the school district to the Hudson Lions Club. The article passed 3276 to 764.

DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

Assessing noted that a deed will need to be recorded to legally effectuate the land transfer.

STAFF COMMENTS

This lot line relocation was approved by a town vote in 2022.
