On November 03, 2018, at 1055 AM members of the Hudson Police Department responded to 58 Barbara Lane for a report of a subject at the residence in violation of a court order. Upon arrival officers were advised the male subject, Christopher Skelley (07/18/1976), was last seen inside the residence. Based on the provided information officers believed Skelley to still be in the residence hiding so they attempted to make contact via cell phone and the cruiser's public address system. Officers were unable to make contact with Skelley and the surrounding area was evacuated as a precaution. The Southern New Hampshire Special Operations Unit (SNHSOU) was activated and members responded to try and make contact with Skelley. After a search of the residence by the SNHSOU, it was determined Skelley had exited the residence prior to the arrival of the first Hudson Police Officers. Officers continued to search the area and based on an anonymous tip Skelley was located at 290 Derry Street Hudson, NH and arrested without incident. Skelley was charged with Violation of a DVP, Burglary, Felony Criminal Mischief, and Misdemeanor Criminal Mischief. Skelley was held without bail and was transported to the Hillsborough County House of Corrections to await arraignment on November 5, 2018.



The evacuated residents were out of their homes for approximately four hours while this incident was brought to a peaceful resolution.
