- The program is not ready to start yet. There was not enough funding for it to begin. We will need to touch base with the YMCA and Keith Bowen to find out the new goal date.


## Freedom Field II Update

- Busy trying to get the ball moving on the field. Director has met with the town engineer a few times, walked the property, and received an itemized breakdown of the estimated cost. It came up higher than expected, $\$ 243,000$. Currently we are at $\$ 180,000$ so it was suggested to build the field in two phases.
- Currently Hudson United is locked into a lease for Freedom Field I and Freedom Field II and gave the director a verbal commitment to give up the rights to Freedom Field II. A letter followed the verbal promise with commitments HUSC wanted the town to promise them. Dave Yates spoke to Steve Towle from HUSC and it seemed that they were hesitant to give up the rights to the field in fear that they will lose the usage of Freedom Field I.. Phone calls continued involving Dave Yates explaining that in good faith, HUSC will still be able to use Freedom Field I. Steve Malizia contacted the town lawyer to have a letter drafted up and get this resolved. However the holdup right now on the field is on HUSC's end.

Report provided by Chrissy Peterson who was the lacrosse Coordinator. She did a great job running the program and dealing with NHYLA which is a lot of work. In the report she explains that the costs to play have increased. NHYLA, the umbrella out league is under, increased the team entry fees and the fees for officials., the rental fee for PMA, and the indoor rental fee at the NH Sportsplex The league purchased new uniforms this year that the players looked great in. Six out of 7 coaches were returning this year. The teams all did very well this year. It's clear the program is blooming.
