The Senior Center is one of our largest programs here at the Recreation Department. In response to the Covid-19


pandemic, we closed

IS PICKLEBALL A Sport? Yes

Pickleball is a paddleball sport that combines elements of badminton, table tennis, and tennis.¹ Two or four players use solid paddles made of wood or composite materials to hit a perforated polymer ball, much like a whiffle ball, with 26–40 round holes, over a net. The sport shares features of other racket sports: the dimensions and layout of a badminton court, and a net and rules somewhat similar to tennis, with several modifications.

Pickleball was invented in the mid-1960s as a children's backyard game. The spread of the sport is attributed to its popularity within community centers physical education classes, public park private health clubs, YMCA facilities and retirement communities. We can now add Hudson to the list!



Hudson Recreation's Travel Monopole and Company


The Recreation Department's Travel League hosts one team per grade if a coach can be secured. As a travel league, it is focused around a higher basketball skill set from our intramural league. Interested athletes are required to try out for their respected team. Each athlete must earn their spot regardless if they have been on a team prior or are new to trying out.

The league cannot work around athlete conflict days. Participants must have a flexible schedule that can be worked around basketball. Only tryout if your schedule is open.

This league travels and will play home games. The MSBL controls the schedule, not the Recreation Department.

Registration fee is \$100 plus the additional costs of uniform and potential tournaments. The \$100 fee will be due within a week of team announcement and the uniform fee will be due the following week due to time restraints.
