  - Hudson Transfer Station is now open the SECOND and LAST Saturday of each month (8:00am-12:00pm) through November. Next two dates are Saturday, August 8 and August 29. Pass Needed for 2020 – 3 free per year per household, one pass needed for each drop off. Passes may be picked up <u>only</u> at the DPW offices Monday through Thursday 6am – 4pm, 2 Constitution Drive, Hudson.
  - Yard Waste, Metal items, and Cardboard can be brought to the Hudson Transfer Station Every Saturday April through the end of November 8:00am-12:00pm {No Pass Needed}
  - Household Hazardous Waste & Electronics Collection: Next collection is confirmed for August 1, 2020, at the Nashua Public Works Garage, located at 9 Stadium Drive, Nashua.

User Fees = \$15 per vehicle, for up to 10 gallons or 20 pounds of hazardous waste. If you bring more than 10 gallons or 20 pounds you will be asked to make an additional donation. Cash and Checks accepted. Reminders: No Latex Paint, No Electronics, No Medications

Roadside Signs: During the February meeting there was a motion by L Kipnes to purchase 25 ecofriendly two-sided signs designed by J Stone-Grimaldi for no more than \$225.00 including shipping that was seconded and passed unanimously. Due to COVID-19 protocols enacted shortly after the meeting this project was not completed. Members need to discuss resuming progress on this project. (At 7:39pm, the June meeting was recessed due to broadcast technical difficulties)
- **9. Roadside Cleanup:** The April 18 Roadside Cleanup was canceled due to COVID-19. As of June 17 both the Hudson Police Department and the DPW have expressed support of the concept of enacting all plans developed for the April 18 Roadside Cleanup on a future date. A proposed date approved by the Police and DPW is October 3<sup>rd</sup>. During the BOS meeting on June 23<sup>rd</sup> the Roadside Cleanup and date of October 3<sup>rd</sup> was approved by the BOS. **Committee members to vote on this event and date of October 3<sup>rd</sup>**.
