Pages explaining the HEAC added to the Sustainability Committee web pages on the Hudson Town website. Progress to date shared by Craig and Kate HEAC goal to reduce electricity bills for homeowners and small businesses. <u>The name "Hudson Community Power" is now formally assigned and protected by law. "Hudson Community Power" would replace Eversource as the source of power on the electricity bills if Residents approve the specific Warrant Article on the</u>

- <u>March Ballot.</u> Residents are encouraged to view the HCTV recordings of Sustainability Committee meetings for the full depth of the discussions during each meeting.
- 9. **Banner for events:** Reviewed proposed design. Discussed design of the QR code. Funds for purchase already approved. Order placed by Debra with Staples so that Banner will be completed for use in time for Old Home Days. Craig made a motion to approve the design which Kate seconded and all present voted to approve.
