 - Trash-Recycling Tonnage Report: 22.49% (Report included in Packet)
 - **Expenditure Report:** Two checks were accidentally sent to Clean Energy for a Municipal Membership. The second check will be returned by Clean Energy and the \$300.00 credited back into the committee's account. (Report was included in Packet. It shows two \$300.00 disbursements) Correct balance is \$736.50.
- 7. Hudson Transfer Station: As of July 1, each residence serviced by curbside collection will be allowed to purchase up to three <u>additional</u> Passes at \$30.00 per pass each <u>calendar year</u>. The dates the Transfer Station will be open: Nov 30th and Dec 28th 8:00am-12:00noon. The Transfer Station is open for yard waste, metal & cardboard drop-offs 8am-12noon every Saturday but <u>only April through November-NO</u> Pass is required. Thus, the Transfer Station will not be open on Saturdays in December through until the beginning of April for metal, cardboard, yard waste other than the scheduled Transfer Station Open Dates. DPW offices are open Monday-Thursday 6:00am 4:00pm 2 Constitution Drive, Hudson. The Saturdays the Transfer Station will be open in 2025 should be released before this committee's meeting on December 16, 2024. See the town website for more information.
- **8. Hazardous Waste Collections:** The 2024 collection season has ended. The next collection event will be in April 2025. Update-Cost: \$20 fee per vehicle, for up to 10 gallons (liquids) or 20 pounds (solids). Cash or check accepted, carpooling encouraged. **No Latex/Acrylic Paint, No Electronics, No Medications** For more information and a complete list of accepted items, please visit: http://www.nashuarpc.org/hhw or call 603-417-6570. NOTE: Old medications_can be dropped off at_the Hudson Police Department. Syringes (in a hard shell container) can be dropped off at local hospitals SNHMC and St. Joe's Hospital.

9. Holiday Lights Recycling Program – Five decorated collection boxes were deployed by the start of the program – November 11th. Four boxes (one each) went to the Rec. Department (Community Center), Senior Center, Town Hall, and Rodgers Memorial Library. A fifth decorated box was delivered to Karl who will manage the collection at Shepards Hill.

The decorated boxes include an 11"X17" banner promoting and explaining the recycling program. A copy of the 11'X17" banner is included in the packet. A one-page flyer was emailed to the Rec. Department + Senior Center, Troop 20, the Lions Club and the Hudson Litchfield Rotary Club for them to distribute to their members via email. Troop 20 was advised that they are welcome to modify the Word docx as they wish to better serve their programs and goals – Christmas Tree Collection + Collection of broken strings of lights.

The whole idea is to divert waste away from the landfill which would save money for the town.

1. Call to Order: at 7:00PM

2. Pledge of Allegiance

3. Public Input: Christine Sullivan, 15 Lorraine St, resident of Hudson, representing Scouts BSA #20 gave a brief introduction of the Scout's association with Christmas Tree fund raiser and Christmas light recycling program for old lights.

Holiday Lights Recycling Program – C. Thatcher reviewed the merit badge program for the Scouts with C. Sullivan. \$130 registration fee, meant to teach members about sustainability efforts with regards to water, food, energy, etc. A merit badge mentor from the Sustainability Committee is requested. B. Guessferd thought that this should be something that a member could do on their own, not as a sanctioned function of the Sustainability Committee. More discussions are to be had later after the meeting.

Flyer for light recycling - See rough draft of a flyer for the 2024 collection season. (included in Packet) The Amherst St. Lowes will be hosting the holiday lights recycling. Seven Boxes have been decorated but the flyer/notice needs to be added. We have received commitments from the Rec. Department, Senior Center, Town Hall, Rodgers Memorial Library and a member will manage the collection at Shepards Hill.

Hopefully, we will have more info in time for the Oct 28 meeting. After some discussion, it was deemed that advertising in local papers was too expensive. Coordination with Alvirne HS....and Middle school still pending. Agreed on the format of a printed flyer. Motion was made spend no more than \$25 for Staples for print light recycling signs by K. Messner, second by E. Thompson. Motion passed unanimously.

- **4. Hydro Group Net Metering Options for Hudson presented by Howard Plante, of Freedom Energy Logistics.** During the July meeting the members discussed- Next steps to review information present to town attorney and the BOS for consideration. Members agreed to table discussion until the Jan 2025 meeting.
- **5.** Clean Energy Membership renewal and Conference: Motion was made to approve a total of \$300 for the membership fee which was made by K. Huber, seconded by K. Messner. Motion approved unanimously. The membership includes two tickets (\$77.00 each) to the Conference. K. Huber and J. Keller will be the members representing Hudson at the Conference. Communication between the Town Admin office and the lead coordinator/contact at Clean Energy has resulted in the proper paperwork now being on file. All that is needed is an email from the Chair to Town Admin Office confirming the authorization of the expenditure.

- **6. Attendance:** Kate Messner, Chris Thatcher, Bob Guessferd (Selectman Laison), Craig Putnam (alt), Karl Huber, Deb Putnam (Chair), Jake Keller (new member), Ed Thompson. Alyssa Hanley (excused absence).
- **7. Approval of Minutes:** September 23, 2024 Motion to approve by C. Thatcher, Seconded by K. Huber. Motion approved unanimously.

As of this meeting the DPW offices are open Monday-Thursday 6:00am 4:00pm 2 Constitution Drive, Hudson. See the town website for more information.

Cost: \$15 fee per vehicle, for up to 10 gallons (liquids) or 20 pounds (solids). Cash or check accepted, carpooling encouraged. - 11. Budget for 2024 to 2025: Review plans and ideas for the next fiscal year and the associated expenditures to expand the Sustainability Committee's communication with residents and the development of fun activities along with increasing recycling Pumpkin Smash event, National Night Out, Roadside Cleanups that include a Thank You lunch, Holiday Lights Recycling., sponsorship of a Sustainability badge through Troop 20, coordinating with Sustainability class through CTE at Alvirne HS, etc. The Hudson Lions Club is very interested in coordinating with the Sustainability Committee to create fun + learning events for residents throughout Hudson. At the end of August, the budget should be submitted to the BOS. For this year, the deadline has been missed.
- **12.** Community Roadside Cleanup (CRC) Subcommittee— K. Huber gave update for the subcommittee, and has been working with HPD, HFD, and DPW and appears to be ready to launch. He also updated members on the web pages that are going to go live on Town website. Final procedure will be presented to the BOS for uploading to the town website. J. Keller asked to be assigned to the subcommittee which he was.
- 13. Composting Subcommittee Updates: C. Thatcher updated members on recent activities. The Hudson Lions Club is very interested in promoting composting. He met with a company called Eco-Tone who lease out their Bio-Digesters (shaped like a shipping container) where composting can be deposited. Works like a trash compactor but it is a composter. Creates "soil sauce" compost. Looking to better understand town needs and interest. Requested input from Town DPW and Budget Committee as we are in the information gathering phase of starting a composting program. The whole idea is to divert waste away from the landfill which would save money for the town.

- 14. Hudson Community Power Hudson Community Power Update started by Craig Putnam not much change, Hudson is at 67% participation, with 99.7% on Granite Basic program. K. Messner attended the CPCNH semi-annual Members meeting. She explained that CPCNH is now 3 yrs old now, 70 member communities now, 80 possible by the end of the year (40% of NH customers). New section on CPCNH website where you can get community benefit report docs under "About Us" section. There has been \$16M in savings state-wide so far, \$76K saved so far in Hudson. A lot of discussion with the Regulatory and Legislative Affairs Committee (RLAC) looking to develop a new charter to be able react to new legislation that comes in. Targeted the New Hampshire Energy Forward Act which was explained as being required to help make community power statewide. RLAC will be meeting on Nov 8 and Dec 13. RTK training was also covered at this CPCNH meeting
- **15.** The next meeting November 25, 2024. Dec meeting, Motion to have Dec 16th meeting instead of 23rd by K. Huber, seconded by K. Messner. Motion passed unanimously.
- **16.** Committee Member & Selectman Liaison Comments: K. Messner Comprehensive Climate action plan kickoff online meeting on Dec 10th, 5:30pm -7pm, and In-person event on Dec 11 at 8:30am-11:30am in Concord NHDES auditorium. No other comments.
- 17. Adjournment at 8:56pm: Motion to adjourn by C. Putnam, C. Thatcher. Motion passed unanimously.
