Article 2 Construction of a New Fire Station Shall the Town of Hudson vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,174,600 for the design and construction of a new fire station on Town-owned land located on Lowell Road, and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$2,100,000 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of Municipal Finance Act (RSA Chapter 33), and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and further raise and appropriate the sum of \$74,600 for the purpose of paying 2015-2016 bond issuance cost and interest on said general obligation bonds or notes? (3/5 ballot vote required) (This appropriation is in addition to Article 3, the Operating Budget.) (Recommended by the Board of Selectmen 5-0) (Recommended by the Budget Committee 7-2)					
Article 3 General Fund Operating Budget Shall the Town of Hudson raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amount set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$24,392,956? Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$24,087,206 which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Hudson or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. 	Shall the Town of Hudson raise and appropriate \$1,581,206 for the operation of the Town Sewer YES Utility? Should this article be defeated, the default budget for the Town Sewer Utility shall be \$1,659,315, which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Hudson or by law; or the Board of Selectmen may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised appropriation for the Town Sewer Utility only. Article 12	Establish Hudson Community Television Revolving Fund	YES	0	
	Shall the Town of Hudson vote to establish a Hudson Community Television Revolving Fund pursuant to NH RSA 31:95-h (e) for the purpose of providing community television access for public, educational, or governmental use? 80% of revenues received from cable television franchise fees, or other income derived from the Town of Hudson cable television operations shall be deposited into the Fund, and the money shall be allowed to accumulate from year to year, and shall not be considered part of the Town's general surplus. The Town Treasurer shall have custody of all moneys in the Fund, and shall pay out the same only upon order of the Board of Selectmen, and no further approval of the Town Meeting shall be required to expend from the Fund. These funds may be expended only for purposes of community television access for public, educational, or governmental, cable facilities equipment, maintenance, renovations, or associated operating and administrative purposes. Article 13	Investment Management Service Alternatives Shall the Town of Hudson vote, pursuant to NH RSA 35: 9-a-II, to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay for capital reserve fund investment management service, and any other expense incurred, from capital reserve funds income? TOWN OF HUDSON WARRANT ARTICLES VOTER INFORMATION

Warrant Article 1 – Election of Officers

<u>Warrant Article 2 - Construction of a New Fire Station</u>- Bond warrant article for the design and construction of a new Fire Station on Town owned land at 204 Lowell Road which will replace the current facility located at 88 Burns Hill Road. (3/5 majority vote required to pass.) (Tax rate impact is 11¢ per \$1,000.)

<u>Warrant Article 3 - General Fund Operating Budget</u> - The recommended Town budget for 2015-2016 is \$24,392,956. This budget includes costs for the five labor contracts that were approved last year as well as increases in State retirement costs. The estimated tax rate for this budget is \$6.44 per \$1,000 which represents a 1.4% increase over last year. (**Tax rate impact is 9¢ per \$1,000.**)

<u>Warrant Article 4 - Sewer Fund Operating Budget</u> – Appropriates the budget for the operation of the Town's Sewer Utility which is funded by sewer user fees and charges. There are no changes to the sewer rates for Fiscal Year 2016. (No tax rate impact.)

<u>Warrant Article 5 - Water Fund Operating Budget</u> – Appropriates the budget for the operation of the Town's Water Utility which is funded by water user fees and charges. There are no changes to the water rates for Fiscal Year 2016. (No tax rate impact.)

<u>Warrant Article 6 - Contract for Hudson Police, Fire and Town Supervisors Association</u> – The Board of Selectmen has negotiated a one year contract with the 26 member Supervisors Association that includes a 2.0% cost of living adjustment and a step raise for those that are eligible. (Tax rate impact is 3¢ per \$1,000.)

<u>Warrant Article 7 - Wage and Benefit Increase for Town Clerk/Tax Collector</u> – Provides for a 2.0% cost of living adjustment for the elected Town Clerk/Tax Collector. The new annual salary for this position would be \$54,921. (**Tax rate impact is less than 1¢ per \$1,000.**)

<u>Warrant Article 8 - Wage and Benefit Increase for Rodgers Memorial Library Employees</u> – Provides for a 2.0% cost of living adjustment for the nine full time employees of the Rodgers Memorial Library. (**Tax rate impact is less than 1¢ per \$1,000.**)

<u>Warrant Article 9 - Renovation of Leonard A. Smith Central Fire Station</u> – Funds the renovation of the Central Fire Station that was originally built in 1952. Renovations are necessary to address life safety code concerns, improve public and handicapped accessibility, update electrical and plumbing systems, and improve the living quarters. It is expected that this renovation will add 10 to 15 years to the useful life of the building. This is a one time expenditure from the Town's unassigned fund balance. (No tax rate impact.)

<u>Warrant Article 10 - Replacement Ambulance</u> – For the planned replacement of a 2006 Ambulance. The funds used to purchase this will come from the Ambulance Capital Reserve Fund which was established for this purpose in 1994. (**No tax rate impact.**)

<u>Warrant Article 11 - Funding for Communications Equipment and Infrastructure</u> – Proposes to add \$200,000 to the Communications Equipment and Infrastructure Capital Reserve Fund which was established in 2013 for the purpose of repairing, replacing or improving the Town's aging communication equipment and radio system. (**Tax rate impact is 8¢ per \$1,000.**)

<u>Warrant Article 12 - Establish Hudson Community Television Revolving Fund</u> – Proposes a revolving fund that can only be spent to provide community television access for public, educational or governmental use. 80% of the Cable Franchise Fees collected by the Town would go to this fund with the balance going to the General Fund to help offset the tax rate. (**No tax rate impact.**)

<u>Warrant Article 13 - Investment Management Service Alternatives – This article would authorize the elected Trustees of Trust Funds to pay for services to manage the Trust Funds out of the gains made by the Trust Funds themselves and eliminate the need to raise funds in the budget for this purpose. (No tax rate impact.)</u>
