Vote by Absentee Ballot

Absentee ballots are an option for registered voters to vote by mail as a substitute to voting in-person. The applicant must first fill out an absentee ballot application in order to receive an absentee ballot.

- If hand-delivering the absentee ballot application to the Town Clerk, the application must be received by Monday, March 13 at 4:00 PM in order to receive an absentee ballot to fill out at that time. A designated delivery agent may also physically bring your absentee ballot to your designated polling location on Election Day, March 14th, by no later than 5:00 PM in order to be counted.*
- If you are mailing the absentee ballot application, the application must be received by the Town Clerk in time to process the application, and in return, mail an absentee ballot to you. When returning the absentee ballot by mail, it is your responsibility to ensure the Town Clerk receives your ballot at Town Hall on or before Tuesday, March 14.
- Any absentee ballot received after March 14 will be deemed invalid and not accepted.
