


Toy Soldiers north side of Library Park c2018

Last year at this time, as I drove south on Derry Road and passed Library Park I noticed crew from our Highway Department placing the toy soldiers on the north corner of the park. As I continued on my way to my appointment in Nashua, I recalled some of the history behind these and other decorations on the park. Perhaps it is no surprise how much these decorations are intermixed with Arthur Provencher and his vision to develop Benson's Animal Park into a theme park.

Each of these painted wooden soldiers stand 12 feet tall and they delight the holiday spirit in each of us with their red and blue uniforms with yellow diamond-shaped buttons. With their white belts they stand at parade rest with their bayonet-tipped rifles at their side. Each has the same plumed hat and facial expression. They can stand in any order but the soldier holding the flag should be in the center.



So, you ask: What does all this have to do with Bensons Park? During the Christmas seasons of 1980 and 1981 Arthur Provencher, then owner of Benson's Animal Park, decorated his park with hundreds of thousands of lights and decorations for the holiday season. These wooden toy soldiers were a part of that display. Even though some 35,000 people came to enjoy these sights and activities, that elusive break-even point could not be reached. His "Christmas in New England" lasted for only a few years.

The tradition of holiday decorations at Library Park was started by Mr. Provencher as a way of advertising the holiday events at Benson's Animal Park. Over time this tradition was continued by the town. The five toy soldiers were purchased by the Chamber of Commerce and donated to Hudson with a plaque "Dedicated to people of Hudson by the Hudson Chamber of Commerce December 1995. Our first photo shows a brochure, complete with a coupon of 50 cents, used by Mr. Provencher to advertise his 'Christmas in New England" tradition during the 1981 season. To obtain many of his lights and decorations, Mr Provencher purchased the complete inventory of a holiday decoration company in Connecticut.

Diane, Michele, Mark, and Lynne. This center opened in 1958 as an open-air shopping center and has since become an enclosed mall. Based upon local memories it is likely that these 5 soldiers were obtained by Mr Provencher from the Peabody Shopping Center.

As time progressed the soldiers were in need of repairs and paint. In February 2004 the soldiers were delivered to the wood shop at Alvirne High School where, under the direction of John Conrad, the Building Trades class repaired and painted the soldiers. When completed they were stored by the Highway Department for use in many seasons to come. Our second photo shows the five toy soldiers standing guard over the 2018 holiday season at the north end of Library Park.

Another remnant of Benson's is the traditional nativity scene tucked away behind Plexiglas in the old town trolley stop. This stop once provided a waiting place for travelers using the electric railroad from Nashua, through Hudson, to Hudson Center and on to Pelham. During the holiday season the stop is used to house the creche from Benson's. The Christmas in New England brochure is a part of the Benson's documentation at the Historical Society. # **November Election Re-Cap**

Attached are the statistics for the November 8th State General Election. We had 10,362 ballots cast, a 62.9% voter turnout. This was a record for a mid-term election. The check-in process with the Poll Pads went smoothly once the voters entered the building. Our Ballot Clerks processed averages of 460 voters per hour at the Community Center and 336 at Alvirne. The Supervisors of the Checklist staff was hampered by having only one Poll Pad at each location to register 610 new voters as well as name and address changes. We did have long lines into the buildings a number of times during the day, as well as parking issues at the Community Center. Chief Dionne and his Officers did a great job of managing those issues with help of DPW staff. There were no parking issues at Alvirne.

I must commend the hard working staff for their efforts. Many stayed after their shift was over to help with the heavy workload or came back at the end of the evening to help with closing the election.

I want to thank Wayne Madeiros and the Alvirne custodial staff for their assistance, and the Hudson Women 's Club for providing dinner for the workers at the Community Center, tabulating the write-ins, and counting the ballots pre-election.

The staff of the DPW efficiently set up and took down both polling places, especially at Alvirne where they came back at the end of the night so the cafeteria could be reset for the next school day.

We did have difficulty in keeping up with entering the Poll Pad slips onto the paper checklist. I will be looking at alternatives, allowed by law, to address this.



# **Property Tax Rates Explanations**

A Revaluation is the process of performing all of the necessary Market Analysis and Valuation steps to determine accurate and equitable values for all properties within a municipality. The purpose of a Revaluation is not to raise taxes. It is to create an equitable distribution of the property taxes, based on market value, required to meet the needs of local schools, government and the county. The Revaluation will be completed for the final property tax bill of 2022. At this time, we are still waiting for the State to send us the tax rate for Hudson.

# Greetings!

#### The Town of Hudson offers a variety of property tax relief programs for property taxpayers.

The tax relief programs are driven by state law (state statutes, aka, RSA's – Revised Statutes Annotated) subject to certain areas that are able to be adjusted locally per tax credit and tax exemption.

The adjustable areas would be the amount of the tax credits, the amount of the exemptions, the qualifying income and asset criteria's for exemptions. The sources of definitions used here would come from; State laws, administrative rules, and the State of NH Assessing Standards Board "Assessing Reference Manual for Taxpayers, Selectmen, and Assessors" – <u>Understanding NH Property Taxes</u>. The advice offered in this communication is not to be considered legal advice.

Solar and Veterans Tax Credit forms can be applied for now for the 2023 property tax year. Deadline To Apply April 17, 2023.

Elderly & Disabled applications will have to wait until the end of the 2022 calendar year as those exemptions have annual income and asset requirements measured on a calendar year basis, January 1<sup>st</sup> would be the 1<sup>st</sup> date to file those with complete documentation backup. Deadline To Apply April 17, 2023.

There are also tax credit programs for veterans. A tax credit is defined as an amount of money that shall be deducted from the person's tax bill. That is to say it is a dollar amount deducted directly from the taxes owed by the individual who is receiving the benefit of the tax credit.

### A RECIPE FROM TOWN HALL Ravioli with Arugula, Tomatoes & Pancetta

- 1 lb. cheese ravioli
- G oz. thinly sliced pancetta, chopped
- 1 (15 oz.) can diced tomatoes, drained
- 3 tbs. olive oil
- 1/2 tsp. kosher salt, plus extra for seasoning
- 1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper, plus extra for seasoning
- 3 cups arugula
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced fresh basil leaves, divided
- 2 tbs. butter, room temp

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil over high heat. Add the ravioli and cook for 7-9 minutes until tender, then drain.

In a large nonstick skillet over medium heat, add the pancetta and cook stirring frequently, until crispy, about 8 minutes. Remove to paper towels to drain.

Add the tomatoes, olive oil, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper and cook for 2 minutes until tender. Add the arugula and 1/4 cup basil and cook until wilted, about 30 seconds.

Stir in the butter and melt. Add the ravioli and cooked pancetta and toss until coated. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

Transfer the ravioli to a large serving bowl. Garnish with the remaining basil and serve.

# Winter Water Tips

The Water Utility would like you to keep I mind as the weather gets cooler some simple suggestions.

Remember to turn off your outside faucets from the inside shut off.

If you are heading south or out of town for the winter, make sure to leave the thermostat in the house set at 55 degrees, or, have the pipes winterized and water shut off at the street.

When temperatures drop to below 20 degrees, to help keep your pipes from freezing, leave an outside wall faucet (usually kitchen sink) dripping cold & hot water so it's warm.


